- All products being considered for the cash

awards, which have not otherwise been eliminated from consideration, will be opened.

- Standard Jar: A wide or narrow mouth clear container specifically or specially designed for canning purposes. The screw type lid must be on in order to facilitate handling after opening. Use new lids and rings.
- Non-acid foods, such as all vegetables, MUST be canned UNDER PRESSURE. Low acid fruits, such as figs, should be made more acid by adding lemon juice as directed in the University Agricultural Extension Service leaflet "Home Canning of Fruits." Tomatoes and fruits (not including their juices) must be processed in a boiling water bath.
- **NOTICE:** Two identical entries are required in JUICES, FRUITS AND VEGETABLES so that one may be opened for judging purposes and the other displayed unopened. If the exhibitor desires the opened jar with its contents, it may be picked up on Friday, September 4<sup>th</sup>. Otherwise, the contents will be given to a charitable group. In that case, both the empty jar and the unopened jar will be returned on Monday, September 21<sup>st</sup> to the exhibitor.
- **Exhibits must be CLEAN, SEALED and ACCURATELY LABELED as to the contents on the side of the jar. Label must include type of processing used.** The name of the exhibitor MUST be on the bottom of the jar.
- **DEFINITIONS:**
  - i. **PICCALILLI:** is prepared from green tomatoes, onions, red peppers, salt, sugar, vinegar and spices.
  - ii. **CORN RELISH:** is mainly corn, seasoned with red and green peppers, onions, celery, diced melon, spices, salt and vinegar with a mustard or tomato base.
  - iii. **CHUTNEY:** Watermelon, cantaloupe, raisins, currants, orange peel, walnuts, sugar, salt, spices and white vinegar.
  - iv. **CHOW:** A minimum of three (3) vegetables in a mustard sauce.
  - v. **PRESERVES:** Whole fruit of uniform pieces of the fruit cooked slowly so that the pieces retain their shape and do not become pulp.
  - vi. **JAMS:** A preserve that is cooked until it is pulp.
  - vii. **BUTTERS:** Strained.
  - viii. **MARMALADES:** Use fruits that have jellying properties containing slices. Small pieces of peel of the fruits in the jelly. Jelly should be clear.
  - ix. **CONSERVE:** Similar to marmalade, but with nuts or raisins. Mixed fruit is used.
